The choreography captures the emotions of the young couple as they fall in love, despite the barriers that finally bring about the story's tragic end. Each revival gives opportunities for new dancers to interpret the doomed lovers. The whole Company brings the colour and action of Renaissance Verona, where a busy market all too quickly bursts into sword fighting, and a family feud leads to tragedy for both the Montagues and Capulets.

Join us for a presentation on the Network's findings, followed by a light lunch and an afternoon screening of the 1958 Lewis Gilbert film *Carve Her Name With Pride*. This classic film tells the story of SOE's tragic heroine, Violette Szabó who trained at *Winterfold* and was posthumously awarded the George Cross.
